Quest students help feed hungry at food drive

More than 70 students and staff from Quest for Success, a nonprofit college preparatory organization, volunteered at Collier Harvest earlier this month to pitch in with postal workers and corporate sponsors from around the region to deliver non-perishable food items to local relief agencies.

This year marked the 25th anniversary of the National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC) Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive and the 11th year Quest scholars have participated in this annual event. Since 1992, more than 17 millions pounds of food has been collected to aid hunger relief according to Collier Harvest website.

Despite of temperatures in the 90's, Quest students worked side by side with other volunteers from the community to gather, unpack, sort and repack more than 250,000 pounds of food, collected at mailboxes throughout Collier County, for distribution to more than 60 charitable organizations across Collier and southern Lee counties including Grace's Place, St.
